- ❑ Created as a result of settlement between VW and EPA
- ❑ Clean Cities is mainly interested in the part of the settlement involving \$2 billion investment in EVs over the next 10 years.
- ❑ Funds will be released over four time periods
- ❑ Each period will focus on a different aspect of EVs
- ❑ Proposal period for the first ended on January 16 and focuses on EVSE
