J. Ben Finley, HGCCC

- Why are we doing this?
 - Obligation to the Department of Energy
 - Document our region's effort in shifting towards alternative fuels
 - Identifies
 - Gasoline Gallon Equivalent (GGE) fuel saved by using alternative fuels
 - Reduction of Green House Gas (GHG) emissions

- What is this?
 - A regional list of yearly (2023) use of alternative fueled vehicles
 - Can generate by vehicle use or fuel sells
 - A regional list of practices that reduces use of diesel powered vehicles
 - Route optimization software
 - Idle reduction policies

- Who needs to fill out a survey?
 - Local Governments
 - Transit Providers
 - School Districts
 - Fleet Managers of private companies
 - Businesses that sell alternative fuels

- What are our goals?
 - Last year
 - Respondents = 24
 - GGE savings = 11.4 million gallons
 - GHG reduction = 55,900 Tons
 - Current goals
 - Respondents = 48
 - GGE savings = More than 11.4 million gallons
 - GHG reduction = More than 55,900 tons

- What is the plan?
